Indonesia's Ministry of Primary and Secondary Education formally recognises a small number of international accreditation agencies, and schools are increasingly expected to show recognised, evidenced standards rather than self-reported quality.

Parent expectations are rising

Alongside community expectations of quality, families are more informed and more demanding about safeguarding, teaching quality, and outcomes.

Sustained Improvement

Schools are required to have efficient frameworks for evidence, reflection, and action across the entire quality cycle.
